




The maintenance technician will use tools ranging from common hammers, hoists, saws, drills, and wrenches, to precision measuring instruments, computers, robots, and electrical testing devices. Most technicians will perform routine preventative maintenance to ensure machines run smoothly. Technicians will inspect, operate, or test machinery or equipment to diagnose malfunctions. The maintenance technician may also diagnose mechanical problems and determine corrections based on blueprints, repair manuals, or parts catalogs.

Career Spotlight Graphic Designer

Graphic designers are creative professionals who combine art and technology to communicate ideas visually. They use various design elements, such as images, typography and colors, to create visually appealing and effective designs. Graphic designers work on a wide range of projects, including branding, advertising, web design and packaging.

A graphic designer's role involves interpreting a client's or a company's message and translating it into a visual language that resonates with the target audience. This could include designing logos, brochures, websites and social media graphics. They need to have a strong understanding of design software and a keen understanding of design principles, color theory and typography to create impactful and aesthetically pleasing visuals.

An associate or bachelor's degree is required for most graphic design positions. Many colleges and universities have programs that have a graphic design emphasis. The annual pay for entry-level graphic design positions in Alabama is \$30,000 with experienced graphic designers making approximately \$60,000 per year.

Career Spotlight **Electrician**

Electricians install conduit and wire, light fixtures, receptacles, and grounding systems to residences, commercial buildings, and industrial buildings. Electricians are needed in all aspects of the construction industry to get lights and power to the equipment. There are three tiers of electricians. A laborer is an entry level position that requires no prior experience or education. The next tier is a Journeyman, which requires 8,000 man hours (approximately 4 years) of verified electrical work experience. This experience qualifies you to take the state exam to be a Journeyman. The final tier is the Electrical Contractor license. This requires the same amount of work experience to qualify for the Electrical Contractor exam, which is more stringent than the Journeyman exam. To qualify for both exams, you must have approximately 4 years of verified work experience. This is an excellent career option for those looking to go straight to work out of high school.

Career Spotlight

Career & Techincal Education Teacher

Career and technical education teachers instruct students in various technical and vocational subjects, such as auto repair, healthcare, and culinary arts.

Most career and technical education teachers work in middle school, high school, and postsecondary schools, such as 2-year colleges. Others work in technical, trade, and business schools. Although they generally work during school hours, some teach evening or weekend classes.

Career and technical education teachers typically need at least a bachelor's degree and work experience in the subject that they teach. The median annual wage for career and technical education teachers was \$61,450 in May 2022.

Career Technical Education is unique in its approach to teaching and learning. Academics paired with real world application has a way of making students feel accomplished and gives them a place to thrive and belong.
